



Free pattern for Giraffe stool



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This fine giraffe stool is crocheted in Infinity Hearts Rose 8/4 cotton, which is a soft and delicious cotton yarn. The giraffe is crocheted as a cover, which is subsequently placed on the stool.

Size

Ca. 45 cm from seat to horn

Materials

[Infinity Hearts Rose 8/4](#). Contains 100% cotton. Mileage 50 g = approx. 176 m.

Yarn Consumption:

6 skeins of [colour 190 Mustard](#)

3 skeins of [colour 228 Dark brown](#)

Crochet Hook: 4,50 mm

Other materials:

1 x [Stool /chair 50x29cm](#)

2 x [Safety eye 30 mm](#)

150 g Filling

Mounting

It will be mounted along the way

Tip

If you want the seat cover, to better stick to the stool. You can pull a piece of elastic, around the edge, under the seat or make a chain of ch, which can then be pulled round the edge.

Abbreviations

st = stitch



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ch = chain

dc = double crochet

tr = treble

() = number of stitches in the row

X 6 = number of repetitions per row

Course of action

Crochet all parts with double thread!

Seat covers

Made in color 190 Mustard. Crochet around

1: 6 sc in MR (6)

2: 2 sc in all sc (12)

3: * 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (18)

4: * 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (24)

5: * 3 sc, 2 sc in next st * x 6 (30)

6: * 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (36)

7: * 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (42)

8: * 6 sc, 2 sc in next st * x 6 (48)

9: * 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (54)

10: * 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (60)

11: * 9 sc, 2 sc in next st * x 6 (66)

12: * 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (72)

13: * 11 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (78)



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14: * 12 sc, 2 sc in next st * x 6 (84)

15: * 13 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (90)

16: * 14 sc, 2 sc in next st * x 6 (96)

17: * 15 sc, 2 sc in next st * x 6 (102)

18: * 16 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (108)

19: * 17 sc, 2 sc in next st * x 6 (114)

20: * 18 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (120)

21: * 19 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (126)

22: * 20 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (132)

23: * 21 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (138)

24: * 22 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (144)

25: * 23 dc, 2 dc in next sc * x 6 (150)

26: * 24 dc, 2 dc in next sc * x 6 (156)

27: * 25 dc, 2 dc in next sc * x 6 (162)

28-35: dc all st (162)

36: * 1 dc, 2 dc together * x 12 (150)

37: Dc in all sts (150)

Close off and fasten the end

Mule / head

Made in color 190 Mustard. Crochet around

1: Make 11 ch, turn (11)

2: Start in 2 sts from needle and place a stitch maker in that st. Make 9 sc, 3 sc in next st, 8 sc, 2 sc in first st, with marker (22)



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- 3: 10 sc, 2 sc in next st, 10 sc, 2 sc in first sc (24)
- 4: 11 sc, 3 sc in next st, 11 sc, 3 sc in last sc (28)
- 5: 12 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 14 sc, 3 sc in next sc (32)
- 6: 13 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 17 sc, 3 sc in next sc (36)
- 7: Sc in all sts (36)
- 8: 17 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 17 sc, 3 sc in next sc (40)
- 9: 19 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 19 sc, 3 sc. In the next st (44)
- 10-19: Sc in all sts (44)
- 20: * 10 sc, 2 sc in next m * x 4 (48)
- 21: * 7 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (54)
- 22: * 8 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (60)
- 23: * 9 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (66)
- 24-31: Sc in all sts (66)
- Now set eyes between rows 21 and 22, with 7 m in between
- 32: * 10 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (72)
- 33: * 11 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 6 (78)
- 34-41: Sc in all sts (78)
- 42: * 11 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (72)
- 43: * 10 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (66)
- 44: * 9 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (60)
- 45: * 8 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (54)
- 46: * 7 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (48)



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47: * 6 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (42)

48: * 5 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (36)

49: * 4 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (30)

50: * 3 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (24)

Fill your head

51: * 2 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (18)

52: * 1 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (12)

53: 2 sc together x 6 (6)

Fill the head well.

Close off and fasten the end

Horn x 2

Made in colour 228 Dark Brown and 190 Mustard. Crochet around

Start with brown

1: 6 sc in [magic ring](#) (6)

2: 2 sc in all sc (12)

3: * 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (18)

4 - 7: Sc in all sc (18)

8: * 1 dc, 2 dc together * x 6 (12)

Change to yellow

9 - 18: dc in all sts (12)



Close off and leave a long piece for mounting

Make a horn.

Remember to fill the horns before sewing them upside down between turns. 36 - 40 and with 9 m in between the horns.

Ear x 2

Made in color 190 Mustard. Crochet around

1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)

2: Sc in all

sc (6) 3: * 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 3 (9)

4: Sc in all

sc (9) 5: * 2 sc , 2 dc in next st * x 3 (12)

6:

dc in all dc (12) 7: * 3 dc, 2 dc in next st * x 3 (15)

8: dc in all dc (15)

9: * 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 3 (18)

10: Sc in every

sc (18) 11: * 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 3 (21)

12: Sc in all sc (21)

13 : * 6 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 3 (24)

14 - 18: Sc in all

sc (24) 19: * 6 sc, 2 sc together * x 3 (21)

20: * 5 sc, 2 sc together * x 3 (18)



21: * 4 sc, 2 sc together * x 3 (15)

Close off and leave a piece for mounting

Now make an ear similar and sew them upside down between rounds. 34 - 37 with 4 m in between ear and horn

The neck

Made in colour 190 Mustard.

Make 48 ch and assemble them into a ring with an sc, which is also the first sc in the next round. Put a marker in the last ch (48)

Now continue around

1 - 10: Sc in all sts (48)

11: * 6 sc, 2 sc together * x 6 (42)

12 - 45: Sc in all sts (42)

46: 32 sc, 1 ch turn now make 20 sc, 1 ch turn, sc in the rest of st (42)

47: Sc in all st (42)

Close off and leave a long piece for mounting.

Fill the neck well as there is nothing else to stabilize it.

Sew the thinnest end of the neck to the head and with the raised side at the back, between rounds. 28 - 42.

The other end stitch on the seat cover to fit the neck straight out to the edge of the seat. But also, be aware that the neck is stretched well towards the middle. To get the best stability of the neck.

Withers

Made in colour 228 Dark brown and crochet directly on the neck.



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1: Start by making a loop



2: Now insert the crochet hook under a mask on the giraffe head, where you think the limb should start. I've started 10 rows over my eyes.



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3: Now wrap the yarn around the needle and pull it through. Now there are 2 loops on the needle.



4: Turn again and pull the yarn through both loops, as when making a sc, but instead of tightening, make a loop.



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5: Take the needle out of the loop. Continue with the next loop. Insert the needle into the last stitch from the previous loop.



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6: Wrap the yarn around the needle, pull through the stitch.



7: Turn again and make a loop



8: Now proceed as described in points 5 - 7. Repeat the points all the way down the back of the head and neck. Once you've reached all the way down your throat, repeat steps 5-7, all the way up again. Repeat the rows up and down until the withers have the desired width.



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Now finish off, by pulling the yarn through the last loop, tighten and make a new loop.

Staple end.





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Spots

Made in colour 228 Dark brown

Made in 2 different sizes 9 large and 7 small

1: 6 sc in magic ring (6)

2: 2 sc in all sc (12)

3: * 1 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (18)



Close off and leave a piece for mounting if it is a small stain. Otherwise, go ahead.

4: * 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (24)

5: * 3 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (30)

6: * 4 sc, 2 sc in next sc * x 6 (36)

Close off and leave a piece for mounting

Now sew the patches on the neck and seat cover.

Tail

Made in colour 190 Mustard

1: Make 12 ch and assemble them into a ring with an sc in the first ch

Continue around with sc in all ch (12)

2 - 31: Sc in all sts (12)

Close off and leave a piece for mounting.

Sew tail with brown while making large loops at each st. Cast off and fasten the end. Now cut up all the loops and cut them to the desired length.

Sew the tail on the seat cover, on the opposite side than the head.

Legs x 4

Made in dark brown and crochet around.

1: 11 ch

2: Start in ch 2 from a needle and make 9 sc, 3 sc in next sc, 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc (22)

3 - 9: Sc in all sc (22)

Cast off 2 km and fasten the end.

Now put the "legs" on the stool's legs.



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Mouth and nostrils:

The mouth and nostrils are embroidered on the head with colour 228 Dark brown.



Then the stool is finished and ready to use.
